RM2.7 MILLION RAISED FOR 11TH SOJ C

The world-acclaimed Sultan of Johor Cup, an annual invitational international Under-21 tournament played in Johor Bahru, is the perfect platform to expose, unearth, and launch new talent and captivate fans.

It is also the perfect platform to market and expose your products during a tournament of this magnitude as it sells. From a six-team affair the tournament this year has expanded to eight teams.

The increase in teams participating will also see a change in the format of the tournament. Instead of a one-round league with the top two playing in the final, this year the teams have been divided into two pools of four teams each. The top two teams in each Pool will play in the cross-over semi-finals with the winners playing in the final and the loser in the playoff for third placing.

Germany, Australia, South Africa, and Great Britain are in Pool A while India, Malaysia, Pakistan, and New Zealand are in Pool B. All matches will be played at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium - the home of the SOJC.

With the exception of Great Britain, the other seven teams will also be playing in this year's 13th edition of the Junior World Cup in Kuala Lumpur from Dec 5-16, and this year's SOJC has been dubbed the "Mini World Cup".

This year's SOJC has also hit a high in terms of sponsorship with a whopping RM2.7 million pledged at its official launch. This is the biggest amount raised since the Sultan of Johor Cup - which features in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) calendar - was inaugurated in 2011.



The 11th edition of the SOJC was launched on September 26 in a glittering ceremony at the Persada International Convention Centre in Johor Bahru.

It was graced by His Highness Tunku Abdul Rahman Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, the Tunku Panglima of Johor who represented his father His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar, the Sultan of Johor.

Also present at the launching ceremony was the Johor State Youth, Sports, Entrepreneur Development and Cooperatives Committee chairman Tuan Mohd Hairi Bin Mad Shah, Johor Hockey Association President Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah, Malaysian Hockey Vice-President Dato' Seri Dr. Anil Jeet Singh plus Johor State Deputy Secretary (Sports, Youth and Volunteers), Dato' On Jabbar and Johor Hockey's Deputy President (1) Dato Haji Amran A. Rahman.

"I am overwhelmed with the response from the sponsors. Our gratitude to them. We remain on track









as a sports hub in this region with many international meets held in the state. We have the facilities - worldclass facilities to host international meets," said Mohd Hairi who also conveyed his heartfelt gratitude to the organizers, volunteers, and other agencies for their good work to make the SOJC a huge success.

The tournament is co-hosted by the Johor State Government, the Johor Hockey Association, and the Malaysian Hockey Confederation.

Fittingly the Johor Government led the sponsorship contribution with RM500,000 and Caikang Holding Sdn Bhd also contributed the same amount. VFive Group and Majulia Group pledged RM300,000 each.

Radio Television Malaysia (RTM), the official broadcaster of the tournament which will be played at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium from October 27-Nov 4, pledged RM200,000.

Capital A Berhad; Genting Malaysia Berhad; Johor Corporation, Tenaga Nasional Berhad; SKS Group Sdn Bhd; and Contemporary Logistic pledged RM100,000 each. KEMBARA MAHKOTA JOHOR (KMJ) ROARS AGAIN

Johor's best-known Mela - Kembara Mahkota Johor (Johor Royal Excursion) - returned this year after a three-year break much to the delight of Bangsa Johor.

The four-day event was held from Aug 5-8 after the much-awaited annual event was suspended in 2019 in the aftermath of the Covid-19 pandemic.

His Royal Highness Major General Tunku Ismail Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, the Crown Prince of Johor, led the Johor Royal Excursion (KMJ) for the first time this year - which involved 879km of travel and crisscrossed the state covering 10 districts.

Stops included Ulu Tiram, Kota Tinggi, Mersing, Kluang, Segamat, Tangkak, Muar, Batu Pahat, Pontian, and Kulai before ending in Johor Bahru.



The excursion, which is designed to foster closer ties between the palace and the people, was initiated by His Majesty Sultan of Johor, Sultan Ibrahim Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar in 2001 when he was the Crown Prince.

The eagerly awaited annual event was flagged off by Dato' Dr. Abdul Rahim Ramli, President of the Johor Council of the Royal Court.

Her Majesty The Permaisuri of Johor, Raja Zarith Sofiah Binti Almarhum Sultan Idris Shah graced the flag-off ceremony from Istana Pasir Pelangi, Johor Bahru, along with HH Che' Puan Besar Khaleeda and HH Tunku Tun Aminah Binti Sultan Ibrahim.

Joining the Crown Prince were HH Tunku Idris Iskandar Al-Haj Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, the Tunku Temenggong of Johor; HH Tunku Abdul Rahman Al-Haj Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, the Tunku Panglima of Johor; HH Tunku Abu Bakar Al-Haj Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, the Tunku Putera of Johor, and Dato' Dennis Muhammad Abdullah.














A memorable and meaningful 41st Wedding A nniversary

There was more to come from Tunku Abu Bakar, The Tunku Putera of Johor, a day later in Race 2 when he clinched another third place finish which saw him end the season as runners-up overall with 137 points just five behind Anthony Liu of China - in the Drivers' Championship.

It was a remarkable feat by the Johor Prince in what is only his second GT3 season. Expect more from Tunku Abu Bakar in the new season.

The Johor Royalty had more to cheer when another Prince - His Highness Tunku Abdul Rahman Al-Haj Ibni Sultan Ibrahim also did well in the weekend in Sepang to finish in 11th position in both races.

The Permaisuri of Johor, Zarith Sofiah Binti Almarhum Sultan Idris Shah described the success of her son as "wonderful and meaningful gift" for their 41st Wedding Anniversary. The Royal couple was at the Sepang Circuit for the weekend.

"It is a wonderful gift for His Majesty and myself in conjunction with our 41st wedding anniversary," said the Permaisuri.

Also at the event were HRH Raja Nazatul Shima Binti Almarhum Sultan Idris Shah, The Raja Puan Besar of Perak; HRH Raja Iskandar Ibni Almarhum Sultan Idris Shah; The Raja DiHilir of Perak; HH Tunku Idris Iskandar Al-Haj Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, The Tunku Temenggong of Johor as well as Dato' Dennis Muhammad Abdullah.

On June 21, 2009, a pulsating Junior World Cup Final was held at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru, with Germany beating The Netherlands 3-1 to take the title. After the final, though, the stadium fell silent.

The then Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) president Prince Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah, who was then Crown Prince of Pahang, did not want the stadium - built at a cost of RM21 mil - to become a Cup Of white elephant.

Thus was born the Sultan of Johor Cup, with Sultan Abdullah, now the King of Malaysia, and His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar, the Ruler of Johor - who is set to be the next King - as the brains behind the tournament.

The two Royals, with strong links, oversaw the birth of the now internationally acclaimed international invitational Under-21 tournament. It is played annually and features in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) calendar.

After the Junior World Cup Final, Prince Abdullah had mooted the idea of the tournament to Johor Hockey Association president Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah during a flight to London for an FIH meeting. Prince Abdullah also wanted the trophy to be named after the Sultan of Johor, to whom he is related by marriage. The rest, as they say, is history.

Both, Prince Abdullah and Manjit identified the trophy at Asprey in London but Sultan Ibrahim had the final say in the design. Once the approval was given it was a handcrafted trophy made of sterling silver at a cost of RM100,000.

Much attention was paid to the minute details when work was in progress on the trophy at Asprey. The then Johor Youth and Sports Committee chairman Datuk Jais Sarday even flew to London to "inspect" the work progress.

When the pick was done the highly insured trophy was taken back to Johor Bahru by Manjit and the first tournament was held in November 2011.

Manjit, who is also vice-president of the Asian Hockey Federation has left no stone unturned in making the Sultan of Johor Cup a "major" in the hockey world.

From six teams back then, it has grown into an eightteam affair this year as it enters its second decade. The tournament was not held during the COVID-19 pandemic years.

The teams taking part this year are defending champions India, Australia, Germany, Britain, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa and host Malaysia, all world-class sides.

Kings cept for Britain, the seven other teams will also compete in the 13th Junior World Cup in Kuala Lumpur from Dec 5-16.

Both the royals involved have shown humility and kindness that left a lasting impression on their subjects.

The Sultan of Johor has his annual Kembara Mahkota Johor (KMJ) for his Bangsa Johor with the royal tagline - The Ruler and his subjects are inseparable (Sultan Johor dan Rakyat Berpisah Tiada) - that promotes communal harmony as tolerance, unity and understanding.

Similarly, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al Mustafa Billah Shah and Raja Permaisuri Agong Tunku Azizah Aminah Maimunah Iskandariah recently embarked on a 10-day "Get to Know Borneo Travel", that covered, 2,332KM of Sabah and Sarawak to get closer to the people.

- The 'Gurkha' of SOJC

He carries no kukri knife, the famed curved blade of the Gurkhas, hand grenades, or other weapons, but Hashim Mohamed Yusoff is the "Gurkha" of the decade-old Sultan of Johor Cup (SOJC).

This year he is entrusted with a dual role. Apart from being the executive secretary of the Johor Hockey Association (JHA), Hashim has been tasked with the job of being the organizing secretary of the 11th edition of the expanded SOJC.

Having been involved with the SOJC since its inauguration in 2011, Hashim has seen the world-acclaimed tournament grow from six to eight teams this year. Along the way Hashim "combats" all that is thrown at him and has fought many a "battle" to ensure that the tournament remains a success.

Hashim claims as the taskmaster, he must lead by example, making sure that everything knits together to ensure the success of the tournament - thanks to his wide experience in running more than 100 domestic and international tournaments.

At the same time, the 55-year-old Hashim looks back with fond memories he had with his mentor, the late S. Satgunam, the former Malaysian Hockey Federation (MHF) secretary who roped him to be part of the organizing team for the 2002 World Cup held in Kuala Lumpur.

It was the beginning for Hashim, who was made the assistant secretary in 2003 and learned the tricks of trade in his job. He took over the hot seat when Satgunam passed away in 2006 due to health issues. Hashim gave up his post as MHF secretary in 2015.

Taking a leaf from his mentor, Hashim says Satgunam's "administrative skills are legendary that brought Malaysia international recognition" and as the task master he stays out of the limelight.

"The players and the facilities take priority. That remains my top priority in any tournament, something Satgunam taught me and I am grateful for that. I am extremely grateful for his guidance. Just like him I have to be meticulous in my job and nothing is left for chance.

"Satgunam drove home a strong message ...that nobody can get lost if they follow the right path. Respect all and do not look down on anyone. Do not hurt anyone and ensure credit is given where it is due," says Hashim, adding that his mentor's guidance is second to none.

As the "taskmaster" he does not want the world's only annual Under-21 invitational tournament to be tarnished in any way. SOJC has established a strong footing internationally.

Besides the 2002 World Cup, Hashim's other tournaments includes the 2009 Junior World Cup co-hosted by



Malaysia and Singapore, FIH Champions Trophy, FIH Champions Challenge, Asia Cup, Junior Asia Cup and the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup from 2006 to 2015.

Hashim's also had the distinction of having worked under the patronage of the late Sultan Azlan Shah, Sultan Nazrin Shah, Al-Sultan Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah and Tengku Majid of Johor.

As the JHA executive secretary, Hashim credits the success of SOJC to the good working relationship he has with incumbent JHA president Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah.

"We have been friends for over 30 years from our hockey playing days. So working with Dato' Manjit is easy as we understand each other well. His passion for hockey is well known and we are committed to ensure SOJC is well managed and keeps its place in world hockey.

"Increasing the number of teams participating from six to eight is a big challenge but we have vowed to make sure the tournament stays healthy and provide the juniors with world class facilities for them to show their skills with the stick and the ball," added Hashim.

Thanks to the late Satgunam, Hashim's administrative and organizational abilities have been put to good use, bringing along a wealth of experience as an international umpire, qualified coach, umpires manager and tournament director.











DATO' MANJIT OUR MAN AT THE ASIAN GAMES IN HANGZHOU, CHINA

Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah is simply a fascinating man in hockey and the Johor Hockey Association incumbent president gets rewarded for his hard work this year.

The JHA and the SOJC organizing committee congratulated Manjit on his selection by the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) to be a member of the Jury of Appeal in this year's Asian Games in Hangzhou, China.

The JHA is also proud that another of its council member, Shaji Balakrishnan, who is the chairman of the Umpires Board, was at the Asiad as a Technical Official for hockey competition.

In March this year, Manjit, who heads the Special Projects and Events was re-elected a vice-president of the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) at their congress in Mungyeong, South Korea.

It did not stop at that for Manjit, who started his hockey administration with the Johor Hockey Association in the early 80s.

There was double joy for Manjit in Mungyeong when he was awarded the AHF Excellence Award at the Congress - due recognition for his work to develop youth hockey in the region.

which is in its second decade is testimony to this. From a six-nation tournament, this year's SOJC will be an eight-team affair.

The man who has been the driving force behind the Sultan of Johor Cup (SOJC) since its inauguration in 2011 and his organizational abilities have earned him high praise all around. Despite his busy schedule as a corporate leader, the annual tournament is something close to his heart.

Manjit who hails from Muar, Johor is a man with vision, strength, and determination marked with perseverance and is a pillar of strength in the highly acclaimed SOJC.

For the record, Manjit was equally good in athletics his first love actually. He was the "Fastest Sikh" in the country at one time when he won the 100m in 11.4s at the Malaysia Singapore Sikhs Sports Council Championships at the age of 19. This was in Penang.

A keen golfer Manjit brooks no nonsense in whatever he undertakes - thanks to his discipline. And it has been a hallmark of his character, both on and off the field.

"I have no worries whenever Manjit is tasked to do a job. The SOJC is a good example. It's a tournament that gets 'thumbs up' all around from participating teams," sums up the current president of the International Hockey Federation (FIH) Dato' Tayyab Ikram.

For the record, Manjit was also the national hockey team manager in 1986 and a former vice-president of the Malaysian Hockey Confederation.



No matter what level, without officials there is no game. Like the players, these officials have earned their place on merit and have worked incredibly hard, making many sacrifices to be in the loop for selection.

One of the proud officials is Johor Bahru schoolteacher Shaji Balakrishnan who has made the nation and the Johor Hockey Association proud. Shaji is the Johor Hockey's Umpires Board chairman.

The Johor Hockey Association congratulates Shaji for making the grade for the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou, China, held from Sept 23-Oct 8.

Shaji was selected as a Technical Official for the Asiad his first Asian Games although he had done the South East Asian Games, popularly known as the Sea Games plus other international tournaments like the Asian Indoor Championships, and four-nation tournaments.

The four-nation Good Luck tournament in Beijing in 2007 was his last tournament as an umpire before switching to technical aspects of the game. Shaji was the assistant umpire manager at the 2013 Sea Games in Myanmar and assistant Technical Delegate to the 2019 Sea Games in Manila.

Shaji has been part of the Sultan of Johor Cup (SOJC) family since the annual Under-21 International Tournament was incepted in 2011 and the SOJC organizing committee is proud of his selection to the Asian Games.



Calling himself a "late bloomer", Shaji, who teaches at Sekolah Kebangsaan Seri Kota Puteri, has another assignment lined up as the Technical Delegate to a four-nation tournament in Singapore from Dec 11-18.

Superb work ethics and unwavering spirit, respect and understanding between officials keeps them acting with integrity - which clearly drives home a strong message why they are a vital cog in any tournament.

Shaji is married to A. Prasana, also a teacher. The couple has a daughter Shyra - the only child - who is following the footsteps of her parents and is expected to graduate from the Tun Hussin Onn Teachers Training Institute in Batu Pahat in two years.

"It was very exciting Asian Games assignment for me. This was my first Asiad and the experience gained in China at this level is priceless and will stand in good stead in my official duties," said Shaji.

A graduate from the Raja Melewar Teachers College in Negri Sembilan, Shaji's playing career was only at district level and played for Kota Tinggi, Pasir Gudang and Johor Bahru - due to work commitments.

This "setback" however, did not stop him from pursuing his hockey career in other capacities and he has been rewarded. In fact, god willing, Shaji could be looking at more rewards coming his way and is prepared to work hard for that.

The lovable Shaji is Johor Hockey's pride.

Former international hockey goalkeeper James D'Cruz is one proud Malaysian whose face glows with pride when one talks about the world-class Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru. Not many are aware of his strong links to the stadium.

His love for the game and country overrode all when the former hockey international and World Cup goalkeeper took up the challenge while others shied away as time was against the deadline - to lay the artificial turf.

Seremban-born James completed the mammoth task of not only laying the artificial turf but also the floodlights at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium. It was all done within a month and this was in February 2009 - a face-saving mission for the ninth edition of the Junior World Cup co-hosted by Malaysia and Singapore from 7-21 June 2009.

The stadium was tested in a four-nation tournament and was described "as the perfect venue for a major international tournament" with world-class pitches and up-to-date facilities. Thanks to James.

Among those who paid glowing tributes were coaches David Ralph (England), Pablo Lombi (Argentina), Pascal Kina (Belgium), and team managers Anupam Ghulati (India) and Khawaja Junaid (Pakistan).

Then Malaysian Hockey Federation (MHF) president Tengku Abdullah was very impressed with the facilities when the stadium was delivered and said:

"Given the short notice to complete it, I am very pleased that now we have two excellent pitches and all other necessary facilities we can host the World Cup." He had earlier visited the stadium for a final inspection.

"The challenge (to lay the artificial turf) brought the hockey out of me," said James as he reflected on his decision that left many wondering if he was in the right frame of mind.

However, there was no budging, and James used his links on both sides of the causeway to get cracking without a doubt. Things were made slightly easier when it came to sports. Sports without borders as they say.

James admits that it was a mammoth task no doubt. It was round-the-clock work for James and the Puteri Pacific Hotel

was his "home" for a month. He made lots of sacrifices but his love for the game and the country was the driving force.

Today the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru - one of the best arenas in all of hockey in Malaysia - is Johor's pride and home to the world-acclaimed Sultan of Johor Cup (SOJC), an annual invitational international tournament that features in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) calendar.

James played for Malaysia in the 1973 World Cup in Amsterdam plus several other international tournaments including the Nehru Memorial Cup (India), and the Pesta Games in Singapore. He was in the 1975 World Cup held in Kuala Lumpur but a broken leg put paid to his dreams.

His late brother Austin Anto D'Cruz was a goalkeeper for Johor before he was killed in a road accident in 1971- just hours after buying a new car in Kuala Lumpur and was driving back to Johor Bahru.

The Taman Daya Stadium was built at a cost of RM21 million and the world-class stadium located on the outskirts of Johor Bahru has a seating capacity of 5,000 while the adjacent practice pitch can accommodate 3,000 spectators.

James was among the elite in the 70s with names like Brian Sta Maria, N. Palanisamy, Michael Yan, and Kuldip Singh.

He migrated to Perth, Australia in 1987 for his children's education. James and his wife Barbara, who retired from Qantas, remain Malaysian citizens. His son Mark is an engineer while daughters Sharmini and Sabrina are accountants in Perth.

For his contributions to the game, both, in Malaysia and Australia, James earned several awards in recognition.







In Loving Memory

AMARJIT SINGH JESSY (1964 - 2023)

He left for his heavenly abode on Feb 22, 2023 - just two days before he was scheduled to undergo heart surgery at a private hospital in Ipoh, Perak. He was 59.

Amarjit Singh Jessy's untimely death left behind a huge void and a glittering legacy as an international umpire and Umpires' Manager that made Malaysia proud in hockey. The retired bank officer is regarded as one of the greatest all-time hockey umpires in Malaysian hockey and will be remembered as a true icon.

Amarjit, who was staying in Canning Gardens in Ipoh, is survived by wife Sujan, daughter Sharon, and sons Darrenjit and Aaronjit.

He had strong credentials in his umpiring career and the best Malaysia has produced to leave a name for himself and the nation in the world of hockey. The fact he was the first Asian - and only Malaysian - to have been awarded the Golden Whistle by the International Hockey Federation (FIH) speaks of his impact on the stick and ball game.

The FIH Golden Whistle is awarded to an individual who reaches the century mark in his umpiring career. Amarjit umpired 154 international matches.

His dedication to the sport and willingness to share his knowledge and expertise with others were second to none. Amarjit was an iconic umpire who brought many aspiring young umpires so much joy. His untimely death left many stunned by the news.

"He was more than just an outstanding umpire. His kindness, empathy, and wonderful humanity left a lasting impression on all. Amarjit simply was a wonderful human being with great values and an indomitable spirit.

"A great friend with a big smile. He was loved by all. We miss him enormously," - Murugan Nair



A former international umpire Murugan, who chairs the Johor Hockey Association competitions committee is also the venue manager for the 11th edition of the Sultan of Johor Cup.

Johor Hockey Association president Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah, who is also a vice-president of the Asian Hockey Federation, described Amarjit as a "vibrant personality with an aura" that was felt in the hockey world.

"Amarjit conducted several umpiring courses for us during the Sultan of Johor Cup. A very knowledgeable personality in the sport. Gone too soon. It's a big loss for hockey. His contributions to the game as an umpire, umpires' manager, mentor, and coach will always be remembered and cherished."

Asian Hockey Federation is also reeling from Amarjit's untimely demise. AHF president Dato' Fumio Ogura, however takes solace that Amarjit has left behind a legacy.

"As a great umpire and mentor, Amarjit's legacy will continue to inspire future generations in hockey - both players and officials." - Dato' Fumio Ogura



International Hockey Federation (FIH) President Dato' Tayyab Ikram, also spoke highly of Amarjit and credited him for his hard work in the development of umpiring.

"Amarjit established his own identity and cut a distinct sight on the field in a capable manner. His journey and determination have been super-inspiring," - Tayyab.

Former Perak coach V. Maniam is still struggling to come to terms with Amarjit's passing, more so as they were close neighbors in Canning Garden and used to meet quite often.

"I coached him when he was playing for Perak in the Razak Cup. He was a defensive player. However, got interested in umpiring and moved towards that direction. For me, he reached the pinnacle of his umpiring when he did the World Cup, Olympics, and other major international meets.

"He was the most recognized and his control of the game was one of the best I have seen. It earned him world recognition and his resume tells all," said Maniam, himself a former international player. - V. Maniam

"Just before his demise, I had a good talk with him regarding the hockey situation in the world and there were plenty of positives in our discussion. His passing shocked everyone.

"He was close to me and my family as we lived nearby in Canning Garden. Hope the national and state associations will recognize and respect his contributions with a reward."

Amarjit officiated at three Olympics - the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, the 2004 Olympics in Athens, and



the Beijing Olympics in 2008. He also did four World Cups - Utrecht, Netherlands (1998), Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (2002), Monchengladbach, Germany (2006) and New Delhi, India (2010).

He also did the Junior World Cup in Rotterdam in 2005, two Commonwealth Games, Champions Trophy, and one Europe Nations Cup. Among the tournaments as umpires' manager were the Azlan Shah Cup (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013); Champions Challenge 2 in Lille France (2011); Champions Challenge in Argentina (2012); Olympic Qualifiers in Japan (2012): Chinese National League, Beijing (2012).

Amarjit became the first in the world to be bestowed a rare honor by the FIH as umpires' manager for five international tournaments in a year and this was in 2013 - an achievement Malaysia can be proud of. In general, an umpire manager will get one or two appointments per year.

He also conducted umpires courses in Myanmar, Thailand, China, Indonesia, and the Asian Umpires Academy. In fact, two weeks before his death Amarjit conducted a course in Dhaka, Bangladesh, and was down to do another in Vietnam.

Though you have left us, your legacy will remain forever. Rest Peacefully.

Malaysian football kingpin Johor Darul Tak'zim - better known as JDT - wrapped up the Malaysian Super League title in style with a 4-0 win over Police FC in their own den for their 10th consecutive title.

The win at the Sultan Ibrahim Stadium gave the Southern Tigers an unassailable 64 points from 22 matches - a 15-point lead over their closest rivals Selangor. JDT's impressive goal tally after the win over Police read 79 goals for and conceded only seven.

Putting that aside JDT is also in line for a quadruple this season, having won the Charity Shield at the start of the new season and the FA Cup in July. In the FA Cup final JDT beat Kuala Lumpur City 2-0. The team is also in the Malaysia Cup semi-finals and will face Perak for a place in the final.

The all-conquering JDT clinched the Super League title without defeat. The only blemish was a 3-3 draw against Kedah in Alor Setar on August 26.

JDT's Argentine coach Esteban Solari - in his first season with the team - is one happy man with the team's consistency in the highly competitive Super League to win the title with four more matches to go.

He has switched focus to the AFC Champions League and the Malaysia Cup. However, JDT lost their opening Group I match in the AFC Champions League against Kawasaki Frontale 1-0 at home on September 19. The other two teams in the group are Ulsan and BG Pathum United.

Johor has more to offer regarding tourism - including enchanting, rustic, and authentic islands.



GREAT BRITAIN **TEAM PROFILE**





Great Britain is the odd team in this year's Sultan of Johor Cup (SOJC) - expanded to eight teams instead of the usual six -in the annual invitational Under-21 tournament in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) calendar.

Of the eight only Great Britain will not feature in the 13th Junior World Cup in Kuala Lumpur from Dec 5-16. Still, Great Britain, having won the SOJC three times - in 2015, 2018, and 2019) and runners-up twice (2017, 2019) - will be a strong contender in the "Mini-World Cup" in Johor Bahru.

Despite their failure to qualify for the World Cup after Great Britain finished sixth in the European qualifier in Ghent, Belgium, the team is capable of holding its own against the seven other teams in the SOJC.

Great Britain is drawn in Pool A with Germany, Australia, and South Africa. Their opening match is against Australia on October 27.

Last year, Great Britain defeated Japan 3-1 in the playoff for the bronze medal match.

The Germans come, still fresh, from winning a junior fournation tournament in Dusseldorf. The manner in which they demolished India 6-1 in the final speaks of their might. Earlier they had beaten England 4-0.

If the list of players includes names like Florian Sperling, Ben Hasbach, Hugo von Montegelos, Fabio Seltz, and Nikas Berendts they ring fear if they are in the team for SOJC and the World Cup.

Germany will certainly start as an early favorite for this year's SOJC what more when they have fond memories of their success at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium. The Germans are drawn in Pool A with Australia, South Africa, and Great Britain.

This will be the seventh appearance for New Zealand in the Sultan of Johor Cup and their best in the Under-21 invitational tournament was a fourth-place finish in 2014, losing 6-2 to Australia

in the bronze medal playoff.

It is a new beginning for Malaysia and we hope to fine-tune the team as seven of the eight teams in this year's SOJC will also play in the World Cup."

The teams are divided into two pools, and Malaysia is gunning for a top-two finish from Pool B which also has India, Pakistan, and New Zealand. "It is a litmus test for us," says Vikneswaran who hails from Johor Bahru and called on the home fans to come and cheer and support the team.
